#### Good Afternoon-

As promised, attached is the staff report for the vacancy to be discussed at the next meeting. Upon further review of the code, they have to decide between appointment or special election at the next meeting, and then make the appointment at the following meeting. Notice of the vacancy has to be posted at least 15-days before the appointment meeting. The staff recommendation is for appointment due to the cost with the special election. I have also prepared the notice which is included. You need to post that at three conspicuous locations.

After the September meeting, if they decide to appoint, then Mo will need to contact the County elections official and provide them with notice of the vacancy. In my experience, the County won't do anything, but we are required by law to let them know. Also, you may want to prepare an application for any interested parties to fill out for the role. That way, the Board can review those in a more straightforward manner. Also, I have attached the relevant statute, which you should include with the staff report. You only need to provide pages 2-3.

**SUBJECT-** Anderson Fire Protection Board Vacancy

#### RECOMMENDATION-

Staff recommends that the Board fill the vacancy by appointment

#### **DISCUSSION**

As many of the Board Members have sadly learned, Board Member James Yarbrough passed away on August 12, 2021. Board Member Yarbrough was an invaluable member of the Anderson community, and his involvement in the Anderson Fire Protection District will be greatly missed.

However, the loss of a Board Member places certain obligations on the District. Pursuant to California Government Code section 1770(a), the death of a special district board member results in the vacancy of that office. When that vacancy occurs, the remaining board member have two options: (1) call for a special election, or (2) fill the vacancy by appointment. (See Gov. Code section 1780(c).)

Calling for a special election is expensive and the District is responsible for covering those costs. That can generally amount to a few thousand dollars. For this reason, staff recommends filling the vacancy by appointment, as the costs associated with that option are minimal.

If the Board decides to make an appointment, it must do so within 60-days of this meeting pursuant to Section 1780. Prior to the appointment, the District must post a notice of the vacancy in three or more conspicuous places in the District at least 15 days before the District Board makes the appointment. For instance, if the Board decides to appoint at the October 2021 regular board meeting, it must post the notice no later than September 27, 2021.

Also, the District Clerk must notify the County elections officials within 15-days of this meeting regarding the vacancy. Should the vacancy not be filled within 90-days of notice being provided to the County, then the Board of Supervisors has the option of filling the appointment. However, historically, the Shasta County Board of Supervisors has declined to fill these vacancies, leaving the decision to the Board Members.

FISCAL IMPACT

The expense of the appointment option is insignificant in contrast to calling for another election or waiting for the County Supervisors to make the appointment; the Clerk's time related to publication of the vacancy and processing applications and the procedures required by Government Code §1780.

# § 1780. Filling of vacancy in elective office on governing board of special district

(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a vacancy in any elective office on the governing board of a special district, other than those specified in <u>Section 1781</u>, shall be filled pursuant to this section.

(b) The district shall notify the county elections official of the vacancy no later than 15 days after after either the date on which the district board is notified of the vacancy or the effective date of the vacancy, whichever is later.

(c) The remaining members of the district board may fill the vacancy either by appointment pursuant to subdivision (d) or by calling an election pursuant to subdivision (e).

(d)

- (1) The remaining members of the district board shall make the appointment pursuant to this subdivision within 60 days after either the date on which the district board is notified of the vacancy or the effective date of the vacancy, whichever is later. The district shall post a notice of the vacancy in three or more conspicuous places in the district at least 15 days before the district board makes the appointment. The district shall notify the county elections official of the appointment no later than 15 days after the appointment.
- (2) If the vacancy occurs in the first half of a term of office and at least 130 days prior to the next general district election, the person appointed to fill the vacancy shall hold office until the next general district election that is scheduled 130 or more days after the date the district board is notified of the vacancy, and thereafter until the person who is elected at that election to fill the vacancy has been qualified. The person elected to fill the vacancy shall hold office for the unexpired balance of the term of office.
- (3)If the vacancy occurs in the first half of a term of office, but less than 130 days prior to the next general district election, or if the vacancy occurs in the second half of a term of office, the person appointed to fill the vacancy shall fill the balance of the unexpired term of office.

(e)

- (1)In lieu of making an appointment the remaining members of the board may within 60 days of the date the district board is notified of the vacancy or the effective date of the vacancy, whichever is later, call an election to fill the vacancy.
- (2) The election called pursuant to this subdivision shall be held on the next established election date provided in Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 1000) of Division 1 of the Elections Code that is 130 or more days after the date the district board calls the election.

**(f)** 

(1)If the vacancy is not filled by the district board by appointment, or if the district board has not called for an election within 60 days of the date the district board is notified of the vacancy or the effective

date of the vacancy, whichever is later, then the city council of the city in which the district is wholly located, or if the district is not wholly located within a city, the board of supervisors of the county representing the larger portion of the district area in which the election to fill the vacancy will be held, may appoint a person to fill the vacancy within 90 days of the date the district board is notified of the vacancy or the effective date of the vacancy, whichever is later, or the city council or board of supervisors may order the district to call an election to fill the vacancy.

(2) The election called pursuant to this subdivision shall be held on the next established election date provided in Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 1000) of Division 1 of the Elections Code that is 130 or more days after the date the city council or board of supervisors calls the election.

(g)

- (1)If within 90 days of the date the district board is notified of the vacancy or the effective date of the vacancy, whichever is later, the remaining members of the district board or the appropriate board of supervisors or city council have not filled the vacancy and no election has been called for, then the district board shall call an election to fill the vacancy.
- (2) The election called pursuant to this subdivision shall be held on the next established election date provided in Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 1000) of Division 1 of the Elections Code that is 130 or more days after the date the district board calls the election.

(h)

- (1)Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, if the number of remaining members of the district board falls below a quorum, then at the request of the district secretary or a remaining member of the district board, the appropriate board of supervisors or the city council shall promptly appoint a person to fill the vacancy, or may call an election to fill the vacancy.
- (2) The board of supervisors or the city council shall only fill enough vacancies by appointment or by election to provide the district board with a quorum.
- (3)If the vacancy occurs in the first half of a term of office and at least 130 days prior to the next general district election, the person appointed to fill the vacancy shall hold the office until the next general district election that is scheduled 130 or more days after the date the district board is notified of the vacancy, and thereafter until the person who is elected at that election to fill the vacancy has been qualified. The person elected to fill the vacancy shall hold office for the unexpired balance of the term of office.
- (4)If the vacancy occurs in the first half of a term of office, but less than 130 days prior to the next general district election, or if the vacancy occurs in the second half of a term of office, the person appointed to fill the vacancy shall fill the balance of the unexpired term of office.
- (5) The election called pursuant to this subdivision shall be held on the next established election date provided in Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 1000) of Division 1 of the Elections Code that is held 130 or more days after the date the city council or board of supervisors calls the election.

**Decisions Under Former Law** 

#### 1. Construction

Under <u>Gov C § 1780</u>, a person appointed to fill a vacancy on the governing board of a special district may serve only until the person elected at the next general election has qualified to fill that vacancy. The person elected in that election shall hold office for the unexpired balance of the term of office. At that time, an election will be held to fill the office for the next full four-year term. <u>Robson v. Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water Dist. (Cal. App. 2d Dist. Sept. 1, 2006), 142 Cal. App. 4th 877, 47 Cal. Rptr. 3d 908, 2006 Cal. App. LEXIS 1352.</u>

#### 2. Construction With Other Law

Nothing in <u>Wat C § 71512</u> contradicts the plain meaning of the words of <u>Gov C § 1780</u> because <u>Wat C § 71512</u> does not refer to the term of office of an appointee but merely authorizes a person appointed to office of director to assume the office, and to exercise the duties and responsibilities of the office subject to <u>Wat C § 71254</u>, which specifies that a vacancy in the office of director shall be filled pursuant to <u>Gov C § 1780</u>. <u>Robson v. Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water Dist. (Cal. App. 2d Dist. Sept. 1, 2006), 142 Cal. App. 4th 877, 47 Cal. Rptr. 3d 908, 2006 Cal. App. LEXIS 1352.</u>

#### 3. Particular Determinations

Under Gov C § 1780, subd. (a), providing for filling vacancies on the governing board of a special district, and Gov C § 61000 et seq., pertaining to community services districts, the sole remaining member of the five person board was not authorized to make appointments to the vacancies. The remaining board members of the district may fill vacancies under the authority of § 1780 only if there are at least three members left to constitute a majority under Gov C §§ 61224 (repealed) and 61225 (repealed). Consequently, it requires the affirmative vote of at least three directors to fill a vacancy. If there are not three directors in office, the power of appointment falls to the board of supervisors pursuant to Gov C § 1780, subd. (b). Price v. Tennant Community Services Dist. (Cal. App. 3d Dist. Aug. 26, 1987), 194 Cal. App. 3d 491, 239 Cal. Rptr. 572, 1987 Cal. App. LEXIS 2059.

Municipal water district erred in failing to require an official appointed to the district's governing board to stand for election to fill the unexpired portion of the four-year term to which he was appointed because, in accordance with Gov C § 1780(a) and (d), a person appointed to fill a vacancy created during the first half of the four-year term of office on the governing board of the district could serve only until the person elected at the next general election took office, and the next general election was to be November 2006, the mid-point in the four-year term that commenced in January of 2005. Robson v. Upper San Gabriel Valley Municipal Water Dist. (Cal. App. 2d Dist. Sept. 1, 2006), 142 Cal. App. 4th 877, 47 Cal. Rptr. 3d 908, 2006 Cal. App. LEXIS 1352.

#### **Decisions Under Former Law**

There was no conflict with constitutional provisions making office of justice of peace an elective one by former County Government Act of 1893, authorizing boards of supervisors to fill by appointment such office. <u>People v. Chaves (Cal. Sept. 20, 1898), 122 Cal. 134, 54 P. 596, 1898 Cal. LEXIS 547.</u>

"Vacancy" as used in former section, was applicable to office of judge of municipal court as to which there had been as yet no incumbency. Wallace v. Payne (Cal. Dec. 1, 1925), 197 Cal. 539, 241 P. 879, 1925 Cal. LEXIS 265.

Last sentence of this section must be taken to mean that no successor to Governor's appointee to fill such vacancy could be elected prior to holding of primary election more than 10 months from inception of vacancy. <u>Brailsford v. Blue (Cal. Feb. 19, 1962), 57 Cal. 2d 335, 19 Cal. Rptr. 485, 369 P.2d 13, 1962 Cal. LEXIS 176; Campbell v. Hite (Cal. Mar. 28, 1962), 57 Cal. 2d 484, 20 Cal. Rptr. 328, 369 P.2d 944, 1962 Cal. LEXIS 191.</u>

Since Gov C § 2, provides, in substance, that no change in law is intended by codification, last three sentences of this section, which are codification of last sentence of Municipal and Justice Court Act, § 9, must be given same meaning as such last sentence. <u>Brailsford v. Blue (Cal. Feb. 19, 1962), 57 Cal. 2d 335, 19 Cal. Rptr. 485, 369 P.2d 13, 1962 Cal. LEXIS 176.</u>

In § 71145, declaring that "Judges shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualify, but the office shall be deemed to be vacant upon the expiration of the fixed term for the purpose of selecting a successor," exception beginning with word "but" is exception to provisions of that section only, and is not repeated in this section, hence term of office of judge of municipal court appointed by Governor for unexpired term of his elected predecessor is for term of his predecessor and until his successor is elected and qualifies. Campbell v. Hite (Cal. Mar. 28, 1962), 57 Cal. 2d 484, 20 Cal. Rptr. 328, 369 P.2d 944, 1962 Cal. LEXIS 191.

Gov C § 71180, suggests that without some specific statutory exception, elections for office of municipal court judge are to be held at fixed intervals; failure of this section to define appointees and its provision for appointee to hold office for remainder of his predecessor's unexpired term make it clear that predecessor's resignation does not cause term to expire, except for appointees to newly created judicial positions, for which appointees hold office only

until successor is elected at next general election and qualifies. <u>Caldwell v. Bruning (Cal. Feb. 4, 1966), 64 Cal. 2d 111, 48 Cal. Rptr. 849, 410 P.2d 353, 1966 Cal. LEXIS 239</u>.

Gov C § 71180, empowers Governor to appoint municipal judge only to fill vacancy. Once appointed, judges may not be involuntarily removed from office by Governor. Caldwell v. Bruning (Cal. Feb. 4, 1966), 64 Cal. 2d 111, 48 Cal. Rptr. 849, 410 P.2d 353, 1966 Cal. LEXIS 239.

General statutory scheme for electing municipal court judges is only one election for any particular term of office, and though election of appointee's predecessor at primary election at which predecessor was incumbent and unopposed exhausted elective process for new term, where predecessors of other appointees resigned before primary election in which they were unopposed incumbents, no election was held and elective process was not exhausted, but rather deferred. <u>Brown v. Hite (Cal. Feb. 4, 1966), 64 Cal. 2d 120, 48 Cal. Rptr. 869, 410 P.2d 373, 1966 Cal. LEXIS 240</u>.

Gov C § 71180, providing that no successor to an appointee to a vacancy on the municipal court shall be elected at any election held within 10 months of the date of the occurrence of the vacancy, is applicable not only to newly created judicial offices, but also to vacancies occurring due to the retirement or death of a judge. Furthermore, since a primary election can in effect be a general election when one of the candidates receives a majority of the votes at the primary, the term "any election" in the statute includes a primary election. <u>Barton v. Panish (Cal. Dec. 20, 1976)</u>, 18 Cal. 3d 624, 135 Cal. Rptr. 65, 557 P.2d 497, 1976 Cal. LEXIS 373.

Gov C § 71180, providing that no successor to an appointee to a vacancy on the municipal court shall be elected at any election held within 10 months of the date of the occurrence of the vacancy, is not an abridgment of the constitutional right to vote, as states are free to fill nonlegislative offices by appointment, election or a combination of both. While such an appointment may frustrate the electoral process and discourage potential candidates from running for office when an existing vacancy is subject to gubernatorial appointment prior to an election, whether such interference is justified when weighed against the policy calling for able interim judges, is a legislative and not a judicial question. Barton v. Panish (Cal. Dec. 20, 1976), 18 Cal. 3d 624, 135 Cal. Rptr. 65, 557 P.2d 497, 1976 Cal. LEXIS 373.

Under Gov C § 71180, providing that no successor to a gubernatorial appointee to a vacancy in the office of judge of a municipal court shall be elected at any election held within ten months of the date of the occurrence of the vacancy, the departure of an appointee to a municipal court office creates a successive vacancy. Hence the trial court properly denied a petition for a preemptory writ of mandate directing the secretary of state to certify the results of a primary election for judge of the municipal court, in which the petitioner had received more votes than had his opponent, who had been appointed to the office at a time less than ten months away from the next scheduled election and thus, had not been required to run in that election and who, a few weeks before the election in question, had been appointed to the superior court by the Governor. The departure of the appointee created a successive vacancy and did not merely reopen the original vacancy. The Governor properly selected a new appointee to fill the new vacancy and, since less than ten months then remained before the next election, the Secretary of State was not required to certify the results of the election. Morrison v. Michael (Cal. App. 1st Dist. Nov. 8, 1979), 98 Cal. App. 3d 507, 159 Cal. Rptr. 568, 1979 Cal. App. LEXIS 2292.

A judge entering office is deemed to do so in consideration of, at least in part, salary benefits then offered by the state for that office. If salary benefits are diminished by the Legislature during a judge's term, or during the unexpired term of a predecessor judge, the judge is nevertheless entitled to the contracted-for-benefits during the remainder of such term (Cal Const Art VI § 16 and Gov C §§ 71145 and 71180). Olson v. Corv (Cal., 26 Cal. 3d 672, 164 Cal. Rptr. 217, 609 P.2d 991, 1980 Cal. LEXIS 154), reprinted, (Cal. Mar. 27, 1980), 27 Cal. 3d 203, 164 Cal. Rptr. 217, 609 P.2d 991, 1980 Cal. LEXIS 246.

Gov C § 71180, providing for the postponement of elections for municipal court (but not superior court) judge in cases where the office was vacated between the last date to file nomination documents and the primary election

date, does not unconstitutionally discriminate between municipal court judges and superior court judges. <u>Cathey v. Weissburd (Cal. App. 2d Dist. July 12, 1988)</u>, 202 Cal. App. 3d 982, 249 Cal. Rptr. 204, 1988 Cal. App. LEXIS 618.

The California Constitution does not require election of judges by majority vote. Thus, Gov C § 71180, subd. (b), providing for election of municipal judges by a plurality of votes, which is justified by a compelling governmental interest to preclude a retiring judge from surreptitiously affecting that judge's replacement, is not unconstitutional. Cathey v. Weissburd (Cal. App. 2d Dist. July 12, 1988), 202 Cal. App. 3d 982, 249 Cal. Rptr. 204, 1988 Cal. App. LEXIS 618.

Gov C § 71180, subd. (b), providing for the postponement of elections for municipal court judge in cases where the office was vacated between the last date to file nomination documents and the primary election date, is clear and unambiguous. The Legislature enacted the statute in order to prohibit a retiring judge from influencing the election by stepping down after the filing deadline. The statute does not deprive voters of the opportunity to vote, and any impact on the right to vote is justified by the prevention of undue influence or taint in the election process. Cathey v. Weissburd (Cal. App. 2d Dist. July 12, 1988), 202 Cal. App. 3d 982, 249 Cal. Rptr. 204, 1988 Cal. App. LEXIS 618.

Gov C § 71180, subd. (b), providing for a waiver of the filing fee for a candidate running for a municipal judgeship in the general election after the election had been postponed due to the retirement of the previously sitting judge, evidences an intent on the part of the Legislature to avoid penalizing candidates. Cathey v. Weissburd (Cal. App. 2d Dist. July 12, 1988), 202 Cal. App. 3d 982, 249 Cal. Rptr. 204, 1988 Cal. App. LEXIS 618.

#### **Opinion Notes**

#### **Attorney General's Opinions**

Positions of general manager of county water district, greater portion of which is located within county territory, and member of board of supervisors of same county constitute incompatible offices. 67 Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 409.

If the City of Elk Grove is incorporated on March 7, 2000, the offices of director of the Elk Grove Community Services District and city council member of the City of Elk Grove will constitute incompatible public offices. A director of the community services district who is elected to the Elk Grove City Council will immediately forfeit his or her office on the district board upon commencement of the term of office on the city council. A newly elected city council member may not participate in filling by appointment the vacancy on the district board created by his or her election to the city council. 83 Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 53.
